Do you think they wanted the dining room to represent the Garden? Where residents and friends mingled together to experience good cuisine, shared conversation and friendship.

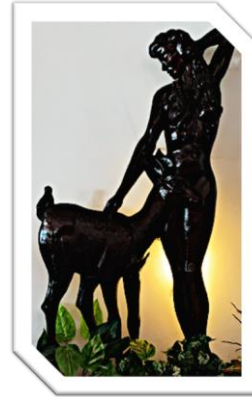

Let us see where the story takes us!

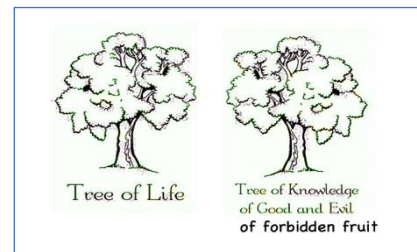
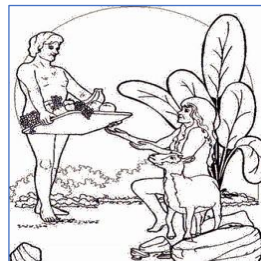
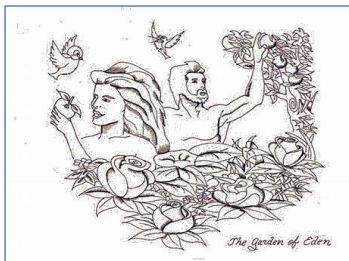
THE GARDEN OF EDEN

The “Fleur-de-lis”, is a stylized lily flower, composed of three petals, bound together near their bases.



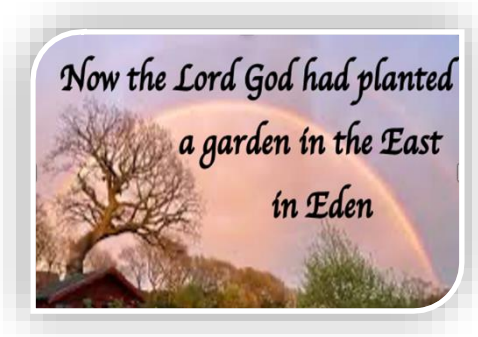
“Fleur De Liz” Emblem
